2023/1020/PVL	Sarah Herriot	15/03/2023 16:00:48	OBJ	<p>As a resident of Denmark Street, I wish to express my concern with the plan to put 19 tables, 38 seats, and 29 barriers around the Thirteen Bar at 1 Denmark Street until 10/11pm 7 days a week.</p> <p>There are a precious few nights during the week when the street is relatively quiet. By allowing drinking out on the street 7 days a week, there will then be no time for the residents to enjoy their own homes, this will become more difficult in summer when one would want to open windows.</p> <p>The councils guidance on this is 9pm, and that would seem appropriate for the area, as this will affect the many residents across the other side of St Giles High Street. The narrowness of the Denmark street and the flat facades of the building echo and amplify noise considerably.</p> <p>I would request only til 9pm and not 7 days a week. This is not appropriate in a mixed residential area. I would also object to tables on Denmark Street - there is no room for this.</p> <p>There is already often excessive noise generated by the queues of people waiting to get into the Outernet venue on Denmark Street til around midnight, and cars blocking the road and pavement.</p> <p>This will also attract local drug users and beggars.</p>

It blocks access to emergency vehicles that may need to access any of the other building in Flitcroft St.</p> <p>The additional noise pollution up to 11pm is also unacceptable for local residents.</p> <p>This will also bring additional beggars, bag thief's and drug dealers to the area. You only need look at other local bars with drinkers outside to prove this already happens.
