Reason(s) for Refusal

1 The proposed fascia signs, by reason of its size, siting, design and method of illumination would result in a visually dominant addition, which would cause harm to the character and appearance of the host building and street scene, contrary to policies D1 (Design) and D4 (Advertisements) of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.

Informative(s):

1 The display of window vinyls, if applied internally is considered to benefit from deemed advertisement consent, as defined by Schedule 3, Part 1, Class 12 of the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 2007, and therefore, does not require formal determination by the Council in the form of an advertisement consent application. If the vinyls were applied externally this would
