There are NO fences (apart from a small one which sits atop a wall) and the erection of one would blight the road. Furthermore, this house is one of a pair of identical neighbouring Victorian houses whose appearance is part of the particular character of the road. To destroy this symmetry with the demolition of the wall would again blight the appearance of the road.
