				However, one thing that will certainly be unsightly from the garden side will be the exit structure for the spiral staircase. It sticks up far too high (I was surprized that it is allowed). It will be quite noticeable. The structure, whatever it is, where people get to the roof space should be no higher than the existing top of the roof. Why do people have to be standing fully upright there in an enclosed space? There could easily be something more like a hatch at waist height instead, which would work perfectly well. The presently envisaged protruding structure would break the line at the top, and randomly increase the height in one place. This should be modified.
