The colour is not acceptable and not comparable with yellow brick so won't blend with neighbouring properties. Timber cladding will look completely out of place. This is not a fishing area and a tall, rust-coloured building looming over the streets, is not comparable with fishermen's huts in an open area on a beach. Timber clad buildings rarely look good after a few years' exposed to our weather and on a very busy street. Was the local air quality tested recently? Before the cycle lanes were introduced and the lane for cars was narrowed? There is frequently a line of vans and cars emitting fumes as they are stuck for a considerable time directly outside 152 Royal College Street. This is due to the difficulty of getting into Camden Road and leaving space for the buses. The traffic congestion in this particular area has increased considerably over the past two years. Consultation 4th July - which year? Who belonged to the CAAC then? Why is disassembly a plus point? Who will want to move the building to another site? The canal front is not a 'hitherto neglected green space'. It is a nature reserve.
