List No. 741. 27/3 - 2/4/23

2023/1298/T. Flat A, 51, Dartmouth Park Hill

No objection to the felling of the dead Pear (T1) or the reduction of the Pyracantha (T2)

2023/1351/T. 1, St Anne's Close

No objection to the work on this multi-stemmed Bay tree (T1) as reduction to previous points.

2023/1361/T. 6, St Anne's Close

No objection to the felling of this Prunus (T1) by the front path as has a DD 5 Day Notice.

List 742. 3/4 - 9/4/23

2023/1368/T. 68, Dartmouth Park Road

1 x Magnolia (T1): No objection to crown reduction of 1.5m as is for general maintenance.

2023/1445/T. 12, Doynton Street

The applicant from No 14, Doynton Street asks for crown reduction of this self-seeded Ash (*Fraxinus excelsior*) which is growing very close to the front wall of No. 12. I, like the arboriculturalist, consider that the tree should be felled, (although more expensive than crown reduction for the applicant). It has already caused damage to the front path, possibly house foundations and guttering, as it is so close to the front wall of No. 12, Doynton Street. If you do not allow it's felling, it must be strictly maintained to prevent further damage.

List 743 10/4 - 16/4/23

2023/1488/Salcombe Lodge, No. 1, Lissenden Gardens.

I understand from Mark Clews at 'Arborhelp' that the tree works applied for to the three Hornbeams and the Wild Cherry, are necessary to comply with statutory duty and general maintenance requirements. The removal of the dead Laburnum is for risk mitigation. I am therefore unable to object to these proposed tree works.

2023/1501/ T. 38, Woodsome Road

No objection to the felling of the Elder, which is growing out of the damaged garden wall, if the wall is then to be re-built.
