## **Assessment**

The s.211 notification is for the removal of a Robinia tree from the rear garden of a residential property that is situated within the Dartmouth Park Conservation Area.

The semi-mature Robinia tree is of low visibility from the public realm and is not considered to significantly contribute to the character and appearance of the conservation area.

The semi-mature Robinia has not yet achieved its ultimate size and form. The tree is causing damage to structures.

When determining s.211 notifications an LPA has no powers to add conditions of any kind, relating to replacement planting or otherwise.

It is not expedient for the council to serve a TPO in order to protect the tree.

The council does not object to the proposed works.
