The City of London Corporation has received a request for an EIA Scoping Opinion under regulation 15 of the Town and Country Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 for the redevelopment of a site

including the Museum of London Rotunda and Bastion House, 140-150 London Wall. The site is approximately 600m to the 1.5 miles to the east of the southern boundary of Camden.
