I am totally opposed to this application for the following reasons: This premises is adjoining and surrounded by a very residential area in the Northern half of Neal Street that includes elderly residents and children. There are no other such premises in this half of Neal Street so this would be a new and significant disturbance to residents. The noise from any outside activity whatsoever will disturb the sleep of residents and noise earlier in the evening disturb the ability of children to study. Any outside activity at all will cause disturbance whether for eating or drinking. The problem in this case is increased because this premises is clearly not set up as a restaurant and the intention appears to be to focus on drinking.
