Hi,

I am getting in touch to lodge an objection to build a giant ferris wheel in Camden market. There are two main reasons for my objection.

The first is on behalf the residents. Whilst the markets are a tourist attraction they sit amongst a highly residential area. Building the ferris wheel will not only ruin the views for a huge number of residents but will also prove a massive invasion of privacy as riders of the ferris wheel will be able to see directly into terraces, gardens and windows.

Secondly, a reason for building the wheel have been cited as drawing more tourists to the area. The infrastructure in Camden is totally incapable of dealing with the current volume of visitors. Every weekend there is a queue out and around the tube station as people wait to enter, with users only able to access platforms via an exceedingly steep staircase. Bins and pavements are completely covered in rubbish. The pavements are entirely clogged as pedestrians spill into the street. With the arrival of the wheel the queues for the station will only worse and this footfall will spill into surrounding residential areas.

Why bring more tourists to an area that is unable to deal with the numbers it has? Building this wheel would only create a more unpleasant experience for both visitors and residents and would be a complete eye sore on the sky line.
