## **Assessment**

The s.211 is for the removal of an elder tree from the rear garden of a residential property that is situated within the Dartmouth Park Conservation Area.

The elder tree is of low visibility from the public realm and is not considered to significantly contribute to the character and appearance of the conservation area.

The elder is growing out of a brick wall and is not sustainable in its position.

The consultation response relating to the removal of a Eucalyptus tree appears to have been submitted in error as it has no relevance the proposed works.

It is not expedient for the council to serve a tree preservation order to protect the tree.
