Hello Elaine,

I am writing to you on his behalf as he has raised an objection to the proposed development at his residence. Troy has lived there since the block was built back in 2014. He is an extremely vulnerable man who is severely disabled and requires 24 hour care. He has a spinal injury and learning disabilities in the autistic spectrum and epilepsy. He needs continuous access to his flat as he is in a wheelchair, and is unable to walk, and requires easy access and working lifts at all times.

Troy moved to Searle House in 2014 and had to live there through the disruption of the work that was done back then to both finish Searle House and the building of Benjamin House, with constant nuisances caused by the development lasting 2 plus years. He will suffer once again from extensive and prolonged noise disturbances/access problems/disruptions to services and from pests if this proposed development goes ahead.

Troy's flat is tiny and airless and he has nowhere within his flat that can escape the noise or situation. He is paralysed and bed-bound. He is dependent upon electronic medical equipment which is at risk in his flat from service interuptions to the electricity/water supplies, and could be affected by the egress of dirt and vibration into his flat.

When scaffolding is put up he will be at risk of being robbed as security will be compromised whether or not alarms are fitted and potential robbers will have will have easy access to his flat. I feel that his mental health will be severely affected by this lengthy building project.
