Replacement of 3 single-glazed timber sash windows to the rear extension of the house with double-glazed timber casement windows.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission subject to the following condition(s):

Condition(s) and Reason(s):

- 1 The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

- 2 The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the

following approved plans 0100-00; 0100-01; OW-70 - CASEMENT FACE DRAIN; OW-70 - FRAME SASH; OW-70 - TRICKLE VENT; 0100-02_A; 0100-04_A; 0100-03_A

Reason:

For the avoidance of doubt and in the interest of proper planning.

- 3 All new external work shall be carried out in materials that resemble, as closely as possible, in colour and texture those of the existing building, unless otherwise specified in the approved application.

Reason: To safeguard the appearance of the premises and the character of the immediate area in accordance with the requirements of policy D1 [and D2 if in CA] of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.

- 2 Reasons for granting permission/consent-

Replacement of 3 single-glazed timber sash windows to the rear extension of the house with double-glazed timber casement windows. The original proposal sought to install metal framed windows but due to the site's status as a positive contributor to the conservation area, this was revised to timber frames. The proposed windows are considered to be appropriate in terms of materials, detailed design and frame thickness and would preserve the character and appearance of the conservation area. In sustainability terms, double glazed units are noted as having the potential to reduce energy costs, provide more thermal efficiency and insulation, offset the need for powered heating and so help reduce carbon emissions, and allow for passive flow of ventilation. There are no amenity concerns as the proposed windows would replace existing windows. The proposal is therefore acceptable.

The proposal is considered to preserve the character and appearance of the Harmond Street Conservation Area. Special attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the Conservation Area, under s.72 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act 2013.

The proposal would not cause any adverse impacts on the amenity of adjoining residential occupiers in terms of loss of light, outlook or privacy.

No objections were received prior to making this decision. The planning history of the site has been taken into account when coming to this decision.

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policies A1, D1, D2 and CC1 of the Camden Local Plan 2017. The proposed development also accords with the London Plan 2021 and the National Planning Policy Framework 2021.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraph 38 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2021.
