Thank you for your letter re. felling trees.

In a Conservation Area at 178 Camden Road, rear garden, a one hundred and fifty year old bay tree has already been felled to ground level without notice. The protected ailanthus has been badly pruned with subsequent branches dropped

into my garden destroying a camellia tree. A row of mature laurel bushes along the

adjoining wall, lopped off, losing privacy and security.

The magnificent Yew is tall and could be reduced, but felled to the ground? I think that is both unnecessary and unwise.

The Yew provides much needed shade (especially now) and privacy from overlooking neighbouring windows.

We appreciate a balance must be found with the management of trees, but as tenants

come and go it is unwise to allow indiscriminate felling of mature trees.
