Assessment

The S.211 notification is to carry out removal of a four metre high Cherry Laurel tree in the rear garden of the private residence, Flat 1, 59 Compayne Gardens, situated within the South Hampstead Conservation Area. The tree is to be removed due to its toxic foliage and the risk that it could pose to humans and wildlife.

While it is acknowledged that the foliage of this shrub tree species can be considered a toxin, considerable quantities would have to be ingested to have a fatal effect, and is generally considered to be more appropriate to educate those who may come into contact with the plant <u>https://www.rhs.org.uk/prevention-protection/potentially-harmful-garden-plants</u>

The tree is of very low or negligible visibility from the public realm, and is not considered to be of cultural, historic significance or adding to the character of the conservation area; nor is it a rare or unusual species.

Therefore, it is not expedient for the Council to serve a TPO.
