This tree like the Mimosa next door (T2) are home to all sorts of birds and insects; they substantially improve our air quality, provide a calm atmosphere free from pollution and traffic noise, create a cooling effect that helps combat global warming, and afford significant privacy to nearby residents by preventing overlooking.
				It is hard to imagine that trees can be got rid of so lightly, without any discussion among neighbours who share a rare resource between two rows of Victorian terraced houses.
				I understand that by regular pruning of upper branches, tree roots can be maintained at a level that does not impact building foundations. Indeed, sudden removal of an entire tree can be just as problematic.
				I would equally object to the felling of the Mimosa (T2) were that to be suggested, for the same reasons, in the interest of our own local environment.
