I am frankly shocked that Camden, whose officers have evidently (based on Fol data and the admissions of the applicant's proxies) been working closely with the applicant and its predecessor over many years, can even be considering authorising the project covered by the Planning Applications, given the severs light level impacts and results, many of which are so far below national standard guidelines.

The health impacts seem to have been ignored. I assume that Camden planning have consulted colleagues in environmental health.

There comes a point when, despite the self serving attempted justifications made on behalf of the applicant, the cumulative and systematic departures from acceptable standards make it unreasonable to allow the Planning Applications to proceed in their present form.
