## **Assessment**

The s.211 notification is for the pruning of a Pittosporum in the rear garden of a residential property that is situated within the Redington Frognal Conservation Area. The applicant is the occupier of a neighbouring property.

The Pittosporum is of low visibility from the public realm and is not considered to significantly contribute to the character and appearance of the conservation area. The pruning is considered minor in nature.

Under common law, a land owner has the right to prune encroaching vegetation back to the boundary without the permission of the tree owner. Anyone can submit a s.211 notification irrespective of ownership, with or without the permission of the tree owner.

The council does not object to the proposed works.
