This tree is many years old (possibly as old as the house) and significantly enhances the conservation area in which it sits by virtue of its diversity, the wildlife it supports and the way it softens the impact of surrounding buildings.	
				Copper beeches of this type are fairly rare in the area and indeed more generally and it would be a tremendous loss to allow this tree to be removed. This is particularly so given that other trees have recently been removed from the grounds of La Saint Union School on the grounds of safety and losing a further tree of this significance would be an enormous blow to the local community, ecosystems and environment. Its removal would also add to noise locally as the trees deaden the sound of traffic and the lovcal school. They are also a defining feature of the neighbourhood.	
				The new owners were aware of the existence of the tree when they bought the property so if they objected to its presence, they should not have proceeded with the purchase.	
				I would have no objection to a professional thinning of the tree and indeed planning permission for this (and removing the crown) has been granted several times in the past. This would seem to be a much better option, preserving and enhancing the tree and safeguarding its positive contribution to the environment.
