I am emailing to express my concerns having seen the draft Deconstruction and Construction Management Plan ("DCMP") for the proposed Great Ormond Street Children's Hospital development

On 3rd February this year I submitted my written submission explaining why I opposed the plan. I also emailed my concerns again on 16th February when it was confirmed the planning application had been approved.

Now I have read the draft DCMP and my concerns are greater still. I will repeat some of the points I have raised before.

I have lived in Camden for over 20 years and had thought that Camden council had the best interests of its residents at heart. It now appears to me that this is not the case.

A building has been approved that contravenes your own development rules and treats with utter contempt the local residents and businesses. Are Great Ormond Street Hospital aware of just how far they have eroded the good will of their neighbours and how much further that will be damaged as the works commence and run for years? The community feel their concerns have been ignored and that alternative options were never properly discussed or explored.

Now the DCMP outlines a deeply flawed plan that runs the risk of endangering lives and at best creating a miserable, almost unliveable environment for what has been a vibrant and special part of London and of Camden.

I cannot express my concerns strongly enough.
