Assessment

The s.211 notification is for the removal of two ash trees (T3, T4) and pruning works to another ash tree and a sycamore tree (T2, T5) in the garden of a residential property that is situated within the Regent's Park Conservation Area.

The trees in question are highly visible from the public realm and contribute to the character and appearance of the conservation area. The tree provide a valuable function of combating air pollution in an area of high airborne particulate pollution due to the frequent local traffic congestion. The trees on site are situated in a sunken residential garden. The trees collectively form one cohesive mass which is a significant landscape feature, particularly given the setting.

T3 and T4 are both mature ash trees. Both trees are displaying signs of *Hymenoscyphus fraxineus*, ash dieback. In addition to the dieback, both trees have areas of decay/necrosis on the lower stem, visible when looking down into the sunken garden from street level. These two factors are considered to significantly reduce the safe, useful life expectancy of both trees. As such is it not expedient for the council to serve a tree preservation order to object to the proposed works.

The pruning works proposed to T2 are considered minor in nature and are not considered to be harmful to the amenity the trees provide or the character and appearance of the conservation area. The proposed works to T5 are considered appropriate and proportionate and not to be harmful to the character and appearance of the conservation area.

The council received one consultation response which is in support of the proposed works.

The council does not object to the proposed works.
