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Central lawn area:

- G1: Group of Mature Birch: Approximately 9.00m: Remove dead wood throughout crowns. Raise crowns by approximately 1.00m. Thin crown density by 20%. To help manage hazard potential.
- T1: Sophora: Approximately 7.00m: Growing adjacent to No.3): Thin crown density evenly throughout by 20%. Reduce back from building, drain pipes and roof to ensure a clearance of 1.00m-1.50m. Remove dead wood. To control encroachment.
- T2: Ash Tree: Approximately 9.00m: Growing close to No.8 in wooded shrub and bed: Remove ivy from crown and main stem down to ground level. Remove major deadwood throughout the crown. Removal of dead Acer adjacent. General maintenance.

Naturalised wild area behind No.8: Adjacent car park:

- T3: Group of Mature Hawthorn: Approximately 5.00mm-6.00m: Remove major dead wood. Remove ivy. Reduce crown approximately 1.20m. General maintenance.
- T4: Multi-stemmed Laurel: Approximately 4.00m-5.00m: Growing inside naturalised area: Reduce by up to 2.00m to manage at reasonable dimensions for the plants location and prevent suppression of understory.
- T5: Mature Lime: Approximately 10.00m: Remove invasive ivy down to ground level. Remove dead wood. Remove 1 x low branch growing toward the boundary fence.
- T6: Mature Poplar: Approximately 17.00m: Reduce back to previous and most recent pollard reduction points. General maintenance.
- T7: Mature Poplar: Approximately 11.00m: Repollard: Reduce back to previous and most recent pollard points. General maintenance.
- T8: Mature Holly: Approximately 7.00m-8.00m: Reduce height by approximately 1.50m. General maintenance.
- G2: Mixed species: small trees and shrubs: Elder approximately 4.50m: Remove lowest limb. Viburnum: approximately 4.50m: Remove lowest limb over garage. Trim back all to tidy. Control encroachment. General maintenance.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

- · Proposals for planting replacement trees (including quantity, species, position and size) or reasons for not wanting to replant.

e.g. Oak (T3) - Whole crown reduction to 12m above ground level, to provide sufficient clearance to property.

## Sketch plan requirements

Your plan needs to show the precise location of the tree(s) in relation to nearby property/roads/boundaries. It should, therefore:

- indicate the main features of the site where the tree(s) stand and its surroundings; in particular, you should:
  - o mark and name surrounding roads
  - o sketch in buildings, including adjoining properties
  - add house numbers or names
- mark the position of the tree(s) to which you want to carry out work and identify them by the number shown in the Tree Preservation Order where possible; if you use a different number, please make sure that this can be matched with your description of the tree(s)
- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:
  - $\circ~$  marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
  - showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
  - o adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)

If it is impossible to identify the tree(s) accurately on the plan (e.g. because they are part of a woodland or group of trees), please identify their approximate location on the plan and provide details of how the tree(s) are marked on site (e.g. high visibility tape, tree tags, paint, etc); trees must not be marked by scarring or cutting into the bark.
