Dear Planners,

I wish to object to this planning application which is within the Camden Special Policy/Cumulative Statement of Licensing Policy 2011, updated in 2022/23 to "The Policy"

This building is in a residential street & the number of residents has increased lately with the building of a Hub Hotel & a number of flats above in Chant House.

These residents will be greatly affected by the proposed application to convert The Forge into a vertical drinking & dancing night club to be open until 2.00am Monday - Thursday, and 3.00am on Fridays & Saturdays. Large numbers of people are expected to attend.

This is clearly very different from the present licensing arrangement for the Forge, which states that alcohol can only be applied with a meal. This obviously requires tables & chairs & limits the numbers who can attend.

I live in Albert Street; we are already surrounded by numerous drinking places & already suffer from late night noise, rubbish deposited in the street & on our doorsteps, in my case also, theft of plants from the doorstep, which happened late at night.

How does it benefit the community & residents of the area to further increase the hours of drinking & carousing by making longer later hours legal for this?

Don't you represent the concerns of local residents any more?
