Subject: Objection to 2023/4415/T

Dear Sir/Madam,

As neighbours and interested parties, we write in respect of planning application no. **2023/4415/T** proposing the felling of two limes trees at 130 Greencroft Gardens.

We strongly object to the application and agree with all of the grounds already set out by our fellow neighbours in their responses to this application, being:

1. Lack of sufficient evidence in the reports provided to justify felling of the trees - the recommendation is not proportionate to the minor damage caused and the casual link is tenuous.

2. Conservation status & amenity value - the trees make up the conservation area that is South Hampstead and contribute greatly to the overall appearance and character of the area.

3. Biodiversity - bees, birds and other wildlife depend on sufficient habitat to survive - by felling the trees, their ecosystem is diminished.

4. Loss of privacy & overlooking - removing the trees will expose homes, further invade privacy and the right to quiet & private enjoyment of our properties.

For these reasons, we object to the application.
