Assessment

The s.211 notification is for the removal of a walnut tree and reduction and thinning works to a group of beech trees in the rear garden of a residential property that is situated within the Redington Frognal Conservation Area.

The beech trees appear to have been reduced historically and are growing in extreme close proximity to each other, which as affected their form. The proposed pruning works are not considered to be harmful to the amenity the trees provide or the character and appearance of the conservation area.

The walnut tree has an area of necrosis and associated decay on the stem from ground level to approx. 700mm up the stem. This is considered to significantly reduce the safe useful life expectancy of the tree to the point that is it not expedient for the council to serve a tree preservation order to protect it. The degree of decay is such that the photo submitted is sufficient, a detailed arb. report is not required to aid the decision making process.

When determining s.211 notifications, the council has no powers to add conditions relating to replacement planting or otherwise.

The council does not object to the proposed works.
