				Cleveland Street is a residential street where a lot of people live in flats. The surrounding are too has a large amount of council housing tenants, many of whom have children. At a time where there is a cost of living crisis, losing a community service such as a Launderette makes things even more difficult for local vulnerable residents and their families, who can't afford a washing machine or the energy prices to use them. And all this for yet another caf¿.
				It was used by students and tourists many of whom stayed in local hotels, student accommodation and the local YMCA. I was often able to give these people advice on the area and how to travel around London.
