Assessment

The s.211 notification is for the pruning of a holly tree in the rear garden of a residential property that is situated within the Redington Frognal Conservation Area.

The notification has been submitted by an agent on behalf of a resident in a neighbouring property. The proposed works relating to overhanging material only.

The tree is of low visibility from the public realm and is not considered to significantly contribute to the character and appearance of the conservation area. The works are not considered to be harmful to the character and appearance of the conservation area.

The proposed works relate to one side of the tree only as the application does not have the right to access the tree owner's land but is within their common law rights to prune overhanging vegetation.
