				Some twenty years ago, 339 Finchley Road was occupied by an evangelical church called The Victory Church. The members of this church used to arrive in large numbers, both on foot and by car. Vehicles belonging to church members typically occupied the residential parking zone, preventing local residents from using the parking spaces which they had paid for, as well as along the Finchley Road.
				The church goers were noisy. On leaving the church they would congregate on the street by their parked cars, talking to each other in raised voices over the traffic, prior to leaving this area. At times there were religious gatherings on the pavement outside the church or even, on one occasion, the forecourt of Finchley Road and Frognal Station in the early morning.
				The redevelopment of the 02 Centre in the near future will deprive this area of retail outlets for several years to come. The presence of this church will not improve the amenity of Finchley Road in any way for local residents.
				AMRA asks the planning committee to reject the application for the change of use of the premises from retail to a place of worship.
