FRONT GARDEN: 2 x Silver Birch (G1) - Fell as close to tree's current ground level as possible and leave the stump in the ground.

1 x Ash (T1) - Crown clean by removing rubbing and significantly damaged branches.

1 x Crab Apple (malus sp) (T2) - Crown thin by approx. 30%.

REAR GARDEN: 1 x Leylandii & 1 x Bay (G2) - Reduce height by approx. 2m - 2.5m and trim all round as hard as possible whilst retaining a green screen.

The Council has considered your notification of intended works to trees dated 25 October 2023 and does not wish to object.
