## **DECISION**

## **Full Planning Permission Granted**

Proposal:

Replacement of rear glazed roof with new glazed roof (part retrospective). Drawing Nos: SITE01; BLOCK02; EX01; PR01 Revision B; Existing photographic survey.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission subject to the following condition(s):

## Condition(s) and Reason(s):

1 The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans: SITE01; BLOCK02; EX01; PR01 Revision B; Existing photographic survey.

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt and in the interest of proper planning.

All new external work shall be carried out in materials that resemble, as closely as possible, in colour and texture those of the existing building, unless otherwise specified in the approved application.

Reason: To safeguard the appearance of the premises and the character of the immediate area in accordance with the requirements of policies D1 and D2 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.

## Informative(s):

1 Reasons for granting permission

The application relates to a building built as the Rosslyn Arms public house in 1869. It is within the Hampstead Conservation Area and is identified as a building which makes a positive contribution to the character and appearance of the area.

The proposal involves the replacement of a rear metal glazed roof lantern with sliding glazed panels, with a Polyester Powder Coating (PPC) painted finish to match the previous. It is partly retrospective following the withdrawal of a previous planning application on 19th December 2022 (2021/5658/P).

Following recommendation from officers, a revision was received to increase the height of the brick work rather than adding a trellis which was considered to add more clutter. The new brickwork parapet would also match the existing.

The rear glazed roof is acceptable in terms of material, location and design.

Overall therefore, the proposal is considered to be sympathetic to the existing appearance of the host property in terms of design, location, size and materials, and would preserve the character and appearance of the building, streetscene and Hampstead Conservation Area, and as such, is acceptable.

Due to the nature of the proposed works they are not considered to result in harm to the amenity of neighbouring occupants.

No objections were received prior to the determination of the application. The site's planning and appeals history has been taken into account when coming to this decision.

Special attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the Hampstead Conservation Area, under s.72 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act 2013.

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with policies A1, CC1, D1 and D2 of the Camden Local Plan 2017 and policies DH1 and DH2 of the Hampstead Neighbourhood Plan 2018. The proposed development also accords with the London Plan 2021; and the provisions of the National

Planning Policy Framework 2021.
