Proposal: Variation of condition 2 (approved drawings) of planning permission ref 2021/2671/P dated 07/11/2022 (Demolition of existing building, and redevelopment to provide a mixed use development comprising a 9 storey building (Plot B) for use as Class E and Drinking Establishment (Sui Generis), a two-storey Pavilion (Plot C4) for Class E and Drinking Establishment (Sui Generis), alongside amendments to Plot C within planning permission 2017/5497/P, namely increase of affordable housing provision in Plot C2), namely to include increased building heights and/or plant enclosures, including lab extract flues to buildings B, C1, C2, C3 required for Life Science use; Revisions to residential unit mix and numbers to incorporate a second escape stair to building C2; Amendments to the affordable work space at basement and ground floor level including a new mezzanine level; alterations to the landscaping to accommodate the canal bridge landing; updates to the C4 roof and lift overrun and associated minor design amendments to the building facades.
