The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed rear terrace and privacy screen, by reason of detailed design, materials, scale and siting would be harmful to the historic interest of the listed building, the wider terrace of listed buildings, and the character and appearance of the conservation area in this location. The development is therefore considered contrary to Policies D1 (Design) and D2 (Heritage) of the Camden Local Plan 2017.

The removal of existing rear window and replacement with a rear door, by reason of its location, visibility and loss of historic fabric, would be harmful to the historic interest of the listed building, the wider terrace of listed buildings, and the character and appearance of the conservation area in this location. The development is therefore considered contrary to Policies D1 (Design) and D2 (Heritage) of the Camden Local Plan 2017
