I enclose an application by Transport for London (TfL) for planning permissions for the installation of Cycle Hire docking stations (18 docking stations maximum and a terminal), which will be placed on the footway on Camley Street in the London Borough of Camden.

It also encourages active travel, offers a sustainable and low emission form of transport and provides users with the fastest option for many short journeys.
