Anyone is allowed to improve their property and if this was an isolated situation I would not be calling it to your attention. But this started with an extensive renovation of the garden flat of no 50 Belsize Park Gardens, followed by an extensive landscaping project which took place outside the front and back of my property. I see that Camden have now granted the same family planning permission to build a small house at the end of the garden of no 50 and it is this same family who own the proposed new house they hope to construct at the end of no 41~53 Primrose Gardens, which back onto the garden of no 50 and which is directly opposite my flat. The owners have different names but they are the parents of the couple who own the garden flat at no 50. One family is developing the entire area. These ongoing and extensive remodels have caused a great deal of inconvenience duress and loss of income to the neighbours in the area. I personally know 3 different families who have chosen to leave their homes at no 50 as they could not handle the level of disruption.
