#### **Statistics**

- We account for around 10% of all UK cPADs
- Have around 1800 responders;
- Submitted over 600,000 status reports to ambulance services;
- Resolved over 2500 maintenance issues with defibrillators;
- Deployed defibrillators to over 3000 SCA;
- Conducted over 450 investigation reports with ambulance services/MHRA;
- Trained face to face well over 250,000 people in BLS (excluding on-line, videos or talks).

#### Why defibrillators?

**Scotland 5% England 9%** 

Only around surivive to leave hospital



People who live in rural areas are 32% less likely to survive to leave hospital

People in the most deprived areas are twice as likely to have an OHCA.



The average age of the people who have an OHCA in these deprived areas is 7 years lower.




People from most deprived areas are 43% less likely to survive to leave hospital compared to those from least deprived areas
