Additionally, the proposed design fails to harmonize with the existing character of the neighborhood and overlooks the privacy concerns of neighboring properties. This disregard for design coherence and privacy further underscores the inadequacy of the proposed plan. In light of these substantial contraventions, including poor design, disregard for heritage preservation, reduction of green spaces, heightened risks to the area, and overlooking the privacy of neighboring properties, it is evident that the proposed plan do
