It is such a beautiful tree, that gives a lot of character to the area and contributes to the greenery and wildlife of the conservation area. I really feel that this tree should be under the TOP.</p> <p>Moreover, another beautiful, mature evergreen tree has been felled, just next to this one, at the same property last month.</p> <p>The reason of die back does not seem justified as the tree appears perfectly well balanced and healthy. It is also at a good distance from the neighbouring wall and it's unlikely to affect it (the wall has just been repaired few years ago by us at 77 lawn road taking into consideration the mature existing trees).</p> <p>Also, does not seem right that all the trees from the property are to be felled in one go, with no staggered approach to allow the replanting and regeneration, especially that the above property is within the conservation area.</p> |
