DD 5 Day Notice (TPO REF C696 2007) REAR GARDEN: 1 x Horse Chestnut (T1) - Fell to ground level.

Thank you for your letter/telephone call of 15 April 2024 giving notice that the above tree(s) are considered dead/dying /dangerous and require emergency works.

The Council confirms that the remedial works as described above are exempt from the need for further notifications or any formal application to the Council and you are therefore allowed to proceed.

Informative(s):

- 1 You are advised that the appropriate standards for tree work are set out in BS 3998: 2010. Failure to ensure that the proposed works are carried out to these standards may result in damage to the tree(s) and may result in legal action by the Council.
- 2 Please note that any approval given by the Council does not give an exemption from the requirements to comply with the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), or any other Acts offering protection to wildlife. Of particular note is the protection offered to bats, birds and their nests from construction works. For

Conditions and Reasons:

- 1 Between November 2024 and March 2025, a Horse Chestnut (*Aesculus hippocastanum*) shall be planted in the garden of the property as an heavy standard with a girth size of 12-14cm at 1m above the root collar no less than 2m from the location of the application tree and no less than 1m from structures unless otherwise agreed with the council in writing, The tree shall be planted and maintained in accordance with BS8545:2014.

Reason: In order to comply with s.206 of the Town and Council Planning Act 1990 (as amended).
