The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

## Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed installation of an extract flue duct to the rear by reasons of the design, materials, location, size, and release point, would constitute an incongruous addition harming the character and appearance host property, rear courtyards and the wider Seven Dials Conservation Area. The proposal would therefore be contrary to polices D1 and D2 of the Camden Local Plan 2017.

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The proposed installation of ventilation required to remove odour emissions would be installed with the release point below the roof line. The applicant has also failed to demonstrate by way of a suitably comprehensive odour control assessment that the ventilation system and extract flue would comply with the council's standards on odour control and it is therefore likely that the installation would cause harm to local residential amenity, contrary to policy A1 (Managing the impact of development) and D1 (Design) of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance the National Planning Policy Framework.
