These trees are of significant stature, mature, appear healthy and provide significant screening and privacy to our house and garden, and those of our neighbours. Removing them would leave us more fully overlooked and exposed to our detriment.  Furthermore, the trees provide area beautification and form part of the 'green corridor' that runs between the houses and along the road. Cutting them down would create an ugly urban void between houses. There appears to be no plan proposed in the application to replace these trees with mature, commensurate and comparable alternatives as a form of remediation. Moreover, as these trees are located within a conservation area, we find it perplexing and surprising that no effort would be made to see that they are either protected or suitably and commensurately replaced.
