I have a south facing terrace and large bow window both of which would be overlooked by the new building in the proposed application.</p> <p>I am well aware that we all live in a vibrant constantly developing city and must all be prepared to adapt to new growth. Without it London would lose its vitality, become moribund and die. So I want to make it clear that I do not object to new building as a matter of course but with the greatest respect I want to suggest to the planners that you have an enormous responsibility to, on the one hand, nurture the growth of this great city, and on the other, to ensure that every development is positive, useful and of the greatest benefit to Londoners while it is being built and for the years after its completion. As I'm sure you know all new work must be planned with the greatest consideration of its future consequences.</p> <p>I'm sorry to say that these plans under consideration do not meet with any of these criteria. As you will hear from other objectors the proposed building is too high, blocks view and sunlight, loses us access to the back of our building due to the closure of Saffron Street and does not in any way meet the criteria I mention above; the steady and careful development of the buildings and amenities of our beautiful city which is ultimately your responsibility.
