Proposal:

Display of one externally illuminated fascia sign and one externally illuminated hanging sign (Retrospective).

Drawing Nos: Location Plan; Floor Plans; Existing Elevation and Section Drawing; Proposed Elevation and Section Drawing; 2 x Photographs.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant consent subject to the following condition(s):

Conditions and Reasons:

- 1 No advertisement is to be displayed without the permission of the owner of the site or any other person with an interest in the site entitled to grant permission.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 2 No advertisement shall be sited or displayed so as to
 - (a) endanger persons using any highway, railway, waterway, dock, harbour or aerodrome (civil or military);
 - (b) obscure, or hinder the ready interpretation of any traffic sign, railway signal or

aid to navigation by water or air; or

(c) hinder the operation of any device used for the purpose of security or surveillance or for measuring the speed of any vehicle

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 3 Any advertisement displayed and any site used for the display of advertisements, shall be maintained in a condition that does not impair the visual amenity of the site.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 4 Any structure or hoarding erected or used principally for the purpose of displaying advertisements shall be maintained in a safe condition.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 5 Where an advertisement is required under these Regulations to be removed, the site shall be left in a condition that does not endanger the public or impair visual amenity.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

Informative(s):

- 1 Reasons for granting advertisement consent:

The proposal is for the display of one externally illuminated fascia sign and one externally illuminated hanging sign. The application is retrospective.

The level of luminance for both signs would be 50cd/m² which is acceptable.

The proposed signage would not obscure or damage any architectural or features, nor would it be harmful of the host property.

Additionally, the proposed signage would not have any adverse impact on the public highway nor be harmful to public safety in accordance with the Camden Planning Guidance and would not have any adverse impact on public amenity.

Overall, therefore, the proposed signage is considered to be acceptable in terms of its size, design, materials, location, luminance levels and methods of illumination.

The site's planning and appeals history has been taken into account when coming to this decision. No objections have been received.

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policies A1, D1 and D4 of the Camden Local Plan 2017, the London Plan 2021, and the National
