Assessment

The s.211 notification is for pruning works to a pear tree. The tree is in the rear garden of residential property that is situated within the Highgate Village.

The pear tree is of low visibility from the public realm and is not considered to significantly contribute to the character and appearance of the conservation area. The works are required to facilitate the installation of a new fence along the boundary between rear gardens, both of which are at 23 Hampstead Lane properties.

The tree is not a noteworthy example of its species and is not of rare species. The tree is of no known cultural or historic significance. The proposed works are not considered to cause harm to the character and appearance of the conservation area.

An error was made at application stage when the location of the tree was recorded on the application form at Flat A, 23 Hampstead Lane when in fact the tree is within the rear garden of Flat 2, 23 Hampstead Lane. This has since been rectified.

A site visit has been made. Minor tree works were undertaken unlawfully prior to determination. It is not expedient for the council to take formal action given the small scale of the unauthorised works. As such the associated enforcement case will with closed.

The council does not object to the proposed works. It is not expedient for the council to serve a tree preservation order to object to the work.
