We have many questions we would grateful for your responses on. I understand the proposed 'outbuilding' will be 2.9 metres high. This is extraordinarily high for an 'outbuilding' and just one of many confusing aspects of the application. 1 What is this 'out building' for ? (it is not stated anywhere we can see.) 2 Why should 8 trees should be cut down? The applicant admits the Jan 2024 pre-app from Camden stated 'any intervention in the garden should be minimal' - so this makes no sense at all. Surely it contradicts several planning requirements for the Conservation Area. 3 Most importantly this new 'out - building' is HUGE. Why is this allowed? It seems it will take up almost the whole Leigh House's back garden and come up to the boundary walls of my house and another 3 houses.
