It does not blend in well with the neighbouring historical assets, and open spaces. The proposed height of the building would detract from their outlook. It is far too tall at 2.9m and would stick out like a sore thumb.

It is also inconsistent with the policy of conserving the heritage value of such open spaces and other aspects that contribute to the setting of existing heritage assets.

Given that the proposed building is within the curtilage of a grade II listed building, the proposed building is contradictory with its existing historical context and would result in a lack of harmony to its surrounding listed neighbouring properties.

				The proposed building would involve the cutting down of 8 trees to make way for the development. It threatens the biodiversity and nature corridors of the historic conservation area. It disrupts the local habitat and adjacent protected green space.
