Proposal:

Creation of a new 2 acre garden to commemorate the life of Queen Elizabeth II within the Store Yard of The Regent's Park. Gardens to include a terrace pergola, a pond with platform; look-out platform using repurposed redundant water tower and various garden areas.

The Council, as a neighbouring planning authority, has considered your request for observations on the application referred to above and hereby raises no objection.

Conditions and Reasons:

Informative(s):

- 1 Reasons for no objection:

The application site is situated within Regent's Park, which is partly located in the City of Westminster and partly in the London Borough of Camden (LBC). The proposed works would be situated within an area of the park in close proximity to the border with LBC.

The proposed works are not considered to impact Camden's townscape and heritage assets due to the siting and scale of the development. The proposal would reuse the existing water tower and the other new structures would have limited prominence due to the proposed boundary treatments/screening.

The proposed development is unlikely to have significant transport or amenity impacts on residents or businesses in Camden which cannot be controlled by the City of Westminster through planning conditions or obligations.

The Council therefore raises no objection to the proposal.
