The tree isnt fully dead, as a branch is growing out to one side, however this means all of the weight is only on one side and is waiting to come down. It a huge danger and we have the support of the neighbour to remove, as they are concerned about their child in the back yard. This tree needs to completely be removed and stump grinded 300mm below ground level.

The other two Poplar trees and a Lime tree just need dead wood removed, and lightly reduced, where its been previously reduced. Lime trees needs ivy removed and thin the canopy density. Crown lift by 4m to improve light underneath trees.
