Dear Camden Planners

*OBJECTION to Application to extend the previous application for the removal of irreplaceable trees*

Sometimes Camden's problems are really tough or almost impossible to resolve. This is not one of them. Just say no.

Please consider the moral rights of these trees and the benefit they can bring to health and healing in this part of the borough with a famous Children's Hospital. Do not allow the misjudged approved application to be renewed.

We, and many other local people have fought hard, over a long period now, on two previous applications asking to fell these until recently TPO trees. We lost very surprisingly last time as the engineers from the applicant agreed with our engineers that there were moderate, conservative measures that could be taken to make sure the houses and trees could continue to live in peaceful coexistence. This time we must fight the natural fatigue of people who have already objected, and force ourselves to throw paid work aside and fight this wholly unnecessary destruction of natural and heritage assets.

So please stick to the advice of our Camden Councillors and the huge numbers of 'experts in place'. Whether local people manage to formally object or not [time is always short] this is their neighbourhood. We have spoken to hundreds of people while campaigning last time. They are amazed the last application could even be considered.

An institution who was until recently planning to sell the three houses, and may soon again, should not dictate the future of a community's air quality, birdsong and happiness.
