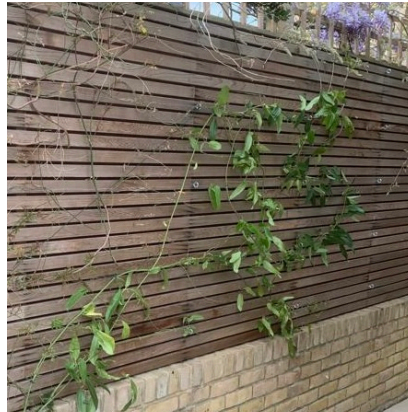


REAR GARDEN MATERIALS

The proposed palette of materials for the rear garden comprise predominantly natural materials, well suited to the vernacular of the neighbourhood and the architecture of the property.

For any retaining structures we will seek to use reclaimed London stocks as the facing brick. On the ground plane, we are looking to use a combination of stone paving and gravel. The stone will form the surfacing for the terrace on the rear of the house; the gravel will form the basis of the paths and seating areas throughout the planted areas.

Any fencing required will likely be in an unpainted, hardwood finish so as to blend quietly into the background. Around the sauna we are proposing to use a composite decking to match the finish of the sauna itself.

Some boundary treatment will be required on the party wall with number 26, on both privacy and security grounds. A simple hardwood fence can be fixed to the top of the wall, with the cladding fitted to both sides of the posts to offer privacy to both properties



FRONT GARDEN

Where indicated, we intend to resurface the various areas with a mix of natural stone, cobble, and gravel. We will seek to blend these new materials in with the adjoining walls and buildings, so that the finishes sit comfortably within the wider environment.

Where steps are shown, we intend to use single piece, full width step treads and risers, with a bullnosed profile on the step nosing. These steps will likely be in traditional sandstone, Yorkstone or Portland stone.
