I understand that there has been a lot of upset and time spent on trying to get operators to come in and take the space and yet no one has wanted to take on the lease on these grounds for the obvious reasons that the cost of the rent and rates will be too high given the potential capacity and number of screens available to make it viable for an operator to take the lease on. I now understand that Vabel, the developers have applied for Class E for commercial, business and service in order to appeal to other types of operators and businesses.

I am objecting to this as i believe that even if the space is not viable as a cinema, it is viable as space for arts, culture, learning and well being that would support and enrich the local community more than another commercial operation that would mean that the offer is 'more of the same' along the high street.
